

## Moose Jaw Telehandler Training Courses

Moose Jaw Telehandler Training Courses - The employer has the responsibility to make sure that their staff are trained to work proficiently making use of telehandler equipment. The personnel have to be assessed for their skill to utilize the machinery. If deficiencies are found, employers should provide training so that staff attain the necessary level of skill. The responsibility level of the person must be taken into consideration when training is provided. Effective training will remedy whichever deficiencies in the skills, understanding and knowledge of telehandler supervisors and operators. Training may be undertaken by hiring an external training provider or through in-house sessions. An assessment upon finishing the training period will determine if the learning objectives have been met or not.

Federal, state/provincial and local regulations set out guidelines for basic telehandler operator training and testing. Basic training does not address such topics as the lifting of suspended loads, the lifting of people, the use of rotating machinery or the use of other attachments. Further training must be undertaken if such tasks are required on the work location.

### Maintenance and Inspection

Like any machinery, a telehandler needs effective maintenance. The machinery inevitably would suffer wear eventually. Proper maintenance is vital to ensuring safe operation of the telehandler machine. Inspections and checks are important to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators must have machine-specific training to be able to prevent, rectify and monitor problems associated with damage, wear and deterioration. Personnel require competence and experience in both breakdown and periodic maintenance. The manufacturer's preventative maintenance instructions should be viewed seriously and followed, considering such factors as frequency of use and environmental circumstances in the work setting.

The responsibility for making certain that the telehandler and its attachments are in good working order lies with both the user and owner of the machine. General maintenance is usually done by the telehandler owner while pre-use checks are normally carried out by the user.
